The Community Plunge	<p>The discussion then turned to the Plunge. It was discussed that it may be too big and daunting to do. This was given as a reason some may have not continued attending the community meetings. Many people felt like we may have to look for other ways to advocate for positive change.</p> <p>The idea of having a town hall style meeting like the one held in Lac du Flambeau in 2008 was proposed. This was a well attended meeting and was well put together. The question about where would we have these town hall meetings was asked. Much discussion was done around trying to figure out how this could be accomplished and the most strategic places to hold the meetings.</p> <p>Someone brought up a question regarding the data on how much court time is taken up with alcohol and drug related issues to be received from the courts. No one knew where the data was or who was asking for it. We also discussed the need for Vilas and Oneida counties to work together and were thankful that Anne was there, so that we might better communicate with one another and collaborate to address the issues.</p> <p>Another issue that was brought up was the ability of the key stakeholders to attend all of the town hall meetings. Many felt that it would be impossible for them to attend all the town hall meetings. The idea was brought up that the key stakeholders could tape a presentation or use the Interactive TV system located in all of our local schools.
